# **ADMINISTRATION AND PERSONNEL**

#### **Recreation and Facilities Restructure**

- With the departure of Mike Baiardo as the Director of Facilities, the organization had the
  opportunity to restructure the recreation and facilities departments to meet the changing
  needs of the district.
  - Both departments work closely together on the vast majority of spaces, projects and events. The Recreation and Facilities Departments have been restructured to both be under the same Director.
  - Kai Wahlgren, Director of Recreation, will have oversight of personnel of the Recreation Department. He will directly supervise the Facilities Manager, Aquatic Manager, Fitness Manager, Athletics Manager and the newly created Superintendent of Recreation position, which replaces the Director of Facilities position.
  - The Superintendent of Recreation will supervise the other Manager positions within the Recreation Department. The position is in the process of being posted. The goal is to recruit, interview and fill the position by the beginning of December.
  - Each position within the department is currently being evaluated and responsibilities will be adjusted to meet the changing needs of the district.

#### NRPA Conference

Mike Selep, Debbie Chase, Tricia Dubiel, Kai Wahlgren, Kim Smith, Chris Finn and Chris Corbett attended the National Park & Recreation Association Conference October 7-10 in Atlanta, Georgia with nearly 9,000 attendees from around the country. The conference provided an exciting mix of educational sessions, networking opportunities, and exhibit space that allowed staff to learn about a variety of topics, including a focus on the use of AI in parks and recreation as well as trends in park design, programming and equipment. Mike Selep had the opportunity to present a full-day preparatory course for the Certified Park and Recreation Executive Exam with 35 professionals from around the country. Congratulations to the Plainfield Park District for being a finalist for the National Gold Medal Award for Excellence in Parks and Recreation.

# **Buildings, Grounds, and Natural Resources**

## Sale of Park District Property

• Typically, the Bolingbrook Park District has performed auctions throughout the year to sell off park district owned items that are no longer useable to the district. Due to the ability to obtain some assets, this is the first auction for the district since spring 2023.

This year's only auction includes the sale of multiple trucks, old preschool class items and an assortment of other items (grounds & IT). As in previous year's sales, the district will employ Obenauf Auction Services to sell the equipment to the highest bidder. An ordinance and exhibit listing the items for sale is found in this Board packet. Staff are anticipating a November auction with items picked up by successful bidders for the end of November, early December.

Staff Recommendation: Approve Ordinance 24-05 authorizing the disposition by auction of personal property owned by the Bolingbrook Park District.

## General

- Staff are working on preparations for the following events: Freaky Fun Friday and Howl-O-Ween 5K.
- With fall weather here, we are preparing for our fall projects such as fall plantings, prescribed burns prep, field/turf maintenance (athletic fields), and many other projects.
- Turf work at the golf course will be starting soon and Drendel Property Management will begin bunker rebuilding in late fall.
- Crews will be starting on winter snow prep in the coming weeks.

## **Buildings**

 Irrigation systems will be blown out throughout the park district; the locations are Lily Cache Sports Fields and Trojan Football Field.

## Parks/Playgrounds/Athletics

- Staff will be starting to make list of winter projects; some of these projects include soccer goal painting, park ID sign painting, picnic table repairs/rebuilds, etc.
- Fall Fest was a huge success this year. Staff helped setup, stage, and clean up Volunteer South for the event.

## **Playgrounds**

- Staff continue to do inspections and playground repairs as needed.
- Wood chips will be added to parks over the next few weeks; the product is blown in by a contractor. This is a special wood chip that is used as a fall protection in our playgrounds. Parks being done are Blackhawk, Drafke, Bradford, Erickson, Jaycee, Knights of Columbus, Prairie Trails, and Oakview Elementary.
- Staff worked on filling cracks on Com Ed Greenway and Lily Cache Greenway Trails.

## Fall Athletics

- Fall sports continue and fields are being used for practices and games. Staff has been on top of mowing, painting and cleaning up athletic areas of refuse. The BAC outdoor athletics will be wrapping up at the end of the month and early November (Soccer Nov. 3, Baseball Oct 17 & Football Oct 29). After sports groups wrap-up their seasons our staff will go out and perform turf work weather permitting.
- The Final BAC Tournament will be held on the weekend of Oct. 25-27 at Bulldog Park.
- Ball mix has been added to several softball fields throughout the parks.
- Staff will be assessing the soccer fields at LCSF to assess the conditions of the fields. At this point the park district will determine what fields we will suggest to the Bolingbrook Soccer Club to close for 2025; we are looking to close 2 fields for 2025. The fields that were closed for 2024 are in good shape.

## Natural Resources Horticulture & Turf

- NRHT crews have been hard at work maintaining our parks.
- Staff will be putting down fertilizer and weed treatment in parks over the next few weeks.
   We are doing treatments internal and not using a contractor anymore.
- All Crews have been working on the Com Ed Greenway trimming back overgrown trees/bushes from Remington Blvd. to Lily Cache Lane for the Howl-O-Ween 5k.
- Tree pruning and stump grinding will begin in November.
- The turf crew have been continuing to maintain our parks by mowing, string trimming and weeding. When not mowing, they have been edging sidewalks and mulching beds and tree rings on the west side of town.
- The horticulture crew has been continuing to weed beds and has been dividing and transplanting plants as needed.
- The natural resources crew has been utilizing a rented forestry mulcher to clear woodlands that had become overgrown with invasive trees and shrubs. The rental of this machine allowed crews to clear 15.2 acres of overgrown woodland in less than two weeks. Hand clearing these same areas would have taken crews at least 9 weeks to do by hand or between \$50,000 and \$75,000 to hire a contractor to clear the same areas. Crews will treat the cleared areas for new growth in late fall and again next summer.

# **Project Updates**

- District received the other State of IL DCEO Grant check in amount of \$120,000 relating to the replacement of the ACC roof.
- Staff is anticipating the start of the Central Park spray park. All product is on site at the district.
- Staff met with Senator Meg Loughran Cappel at Clow airport to discuss funding opportunities for future projects at the district. Conversations went very well.
- Staff are working on creating a document to provide Representatives & Senators within the Village of Bolingbrook to outline future capital needs.
- Staff are working with vendors to install an awning at Ashbury's Boughton Ridge for the patio.

## Pre School / Early Childhood

- Registration is still being accepted for the 2024-2025 school year. The Preschool
  program currently has 151 enrollees with a few children dropping out to attend services at
  Valley View School District. The preschoolers will be taking their fall pictures with
  PhotoMonkyee the week of October 7 and are looking forward to the return of
  Fountaindale Public Library Storytime's in the classroom that starts in October with Ms.
  Jaci.
- Early Childhood programs start the week of September 23 and program enrollment numbers for the first session out of three for fall have 84 children enrolled from Little Learners to Brainy Kids.

## Dance

- The BPD Dance Company placed second in the Dance/Gymnastics category in the Pathways Parade on September 8.
- The BPD Dance Company will be participating in the Trunk or Treat portion of our Freaky Fun Friday event.
- Fall dance classes are going strong. The second session of fall dance classes begins on October 28.

## Theatre

 Rehearsals began September 5 for the fall production of "A True Family Christmas". The show will be held at Brooks Middle School in December. The cast is set at 25 for this show.

## Gymnastics/Cheer/Ninja

- Fall session two begins October 21 for all gymnastics, cheer and ninja classes.
- Adult Gymnasts will be having a pop in on Wednesday, October 16 from 6:30-8:30 pm, all levels welcome!
- The Illusions Gymnastics Team is participating in the Freaky Fun Friday Trunk or Treat event on Friday, October 18.
- Preschool gymnasts can dress up in costume and come join us for a Halloween Gymnastics Pop In on Thursday, October 31 from 11:00 am-12:00 pm - only \$5!

## REACH

- Enrollment for the 2024-2025 school year is picking up for the two sites, Pioneer and Jonas Salk Elementary School. Pioneer currently has 93 children registered as compared to 95 this time last year, and Jonas Salk has 45 children registered which is the same as last year. Registration is still on-going, and new participants are being added weekly.
- Day off camp will be offering 3 day off school options in October. First day off camp is on October 14 for Indigenous Peoples Day. Based off guardian's feedback, camp will continue to be offered for parent teacher conferences on October 24 and 25. All dates are projected to run.

## Youth

As Youth Program enrollment is picking up for the 2<sup>nd</sup> an 3<sup>rd</sup> sessions for fall with the 1<sup>st</sup> session numbers lower than anticipated. However, the Minecraft Engineering and Lego Robotics programs are both running in September. Newly offered classes are seeing slow enrollment and is typical for new programs.

 The Bolingbrook Park District is anticipated to continue its partnership with VVSD 21<sup>st</sup> Century Grant program in late October, offering Enrichment Programs to each of the 10 sites. Activities will include music appreciation, the history of sports, dance, nature, crafting and babysitting first aid.

## **Enrichment Programs**

 To celebrate Halloween, participants are invited to two events on October 26, "Pumpkin Decorating for Little Kids" and "Pumpkin Carving for Big Kids." Children ages 3-7 will use paint, stickers and more to customize their own pumpkin before themed playing games. Crafters 8 years and older (including adults!) will receive instruction on carving techniques using various tools

## Free Events

This month's Free Family Event will take place at Bolingbrook Recreation and Aquatic Complex on Friday, October 18 from 5:30-7:30 pm for Freaky Fun Friday. The event will feature a "Beetlejuice" inspired haunted house, outdoor games, and a trunk or treat trail hosted by various park district departments and community partners. Last year's event welcomed over 600 attendees—a similar turnout is expected this year!

## Howl-O-Ween 5K

 The Howl-O-Ween 5K event will take place on Sunday, October 13 at Remington Sports Complex. Last year we had 115 participants and staff are projecting to have a similar number again this year.

## **Pumpkin Shoot**

• After Halloween, residents are invited to bring their old pumpkins to an archery special event, the Pumpkin Shoot on November 2<sup>nd</sup>! All participants will have a chance to win a small prize after losing their arrows on the unsuspecting gourds.

## Adult Trips

- Spaces are filling up fast for the upcoming outing to Starved Rock Lodge in Utica, IL to see a live music performance by Rosie and the Rivets. This costumed cover-band brings back the tunes of the 1950's and 60's as guests enjoy a lunch service.

 Victory Mixed Martial Arts is still taking enrollment for their Fall classes that started on October 2 and for their later classes that begin on November 13<sup>t</sup>


## Climbing Wall






### Website and Social Activity Settling into Normal Fall Patterns









## **Bolingbrook Park District Customer Care Initiatives**
